### Exercise E12 Conversions: Battery

2. How many minutes could a battery with  $10\text{ kWh}$  of energy supplied by a power source provide the given power for the indicated time?

#### Reputation

$$\begin{aligned} t &= 200'000 \sim \{\text{min}\} \end{aligned}$$

There are additional losses:

$$\begin{aligned} W &= 10 \sim \{\text{kWh}\} \quad \&= 10'000 \sim \{\text{Wh}\} \\ t &= \frac{W}{P} \\ &= \frac{10'000 \sim \{\text{Wh}\}}{5 \sim \{\text{W}\}} \quad \&= 2'000 \sim \{\text{min}\} \\ &= 33 \sim \{\text{days}\} \end{aligned}$$

200'000 (min) quad = 199 (days)

- The battery has an internal resistance. Depending on the current the battery provides, this leads to internal losses.
- The internal resistance of the battery depends on the state of charge (SoC) of the battery.
- The wires also add additional losses to the system.

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
